Quality Assurance in Higher Education

Site Visit Schedule

Three days found to be sufficient.

 Visits to three HEIs, which enabled the Panel to collect additional information from faculty and staff who did not attend the scheduled interviews – added value to the Review Panel Report.



Self-Assessment Report (SAR)

- Agency felt that they were not familiar with the ASG-QA.
- An orientation/induction on the Standards and Guidelines would be helpful in writing the SAR.
- There were a number of repetitions in addressing certain standards in Parts B and C – perhaps due to lack of understanding of the difference between Parts B and C or it could have been due to the structure of the SAR template.



(SAR)...cont.

- SAR development may have been a challenge – one-man show or insufficient preparatory time.
- Seemed that not all staff members were familiar with the contents of the SAR.
- The SAR was still in draft form when the Panel received it (spelling mistakes, repetition of certain paragraphs and/or graphs, typos, etc.).



Evidence/ Supportive Documents

 A lot of evidence documents were provided, but they were not well organised – the Panel could have missed important documents in the process.

 Agency's website was a valuable source of information.



Role of the Secretary

- There is a need to clarify the role of the Secretary, e.g.:
 - only taking notes, compiling the draft report and circulating it for input?
 - participating as a full panel member, writing a portion of the report and consolidating the various parts?
 - consolidating the write-ups of panel members and circulating the draft report for comments/ input?



Specific Standards the Agency found Challenging to Address

Part B

 Standard 1. Objectives of External Quality Assurance and Consideration for Internal Quality Assurance

 This standard was not interpreted too well – was a bit confusing for the Agency.



Recommendations

1. SAR:

- Brief training on the ASG-QA (Parts B and C) through a webinar/Zoom meeting with the key teams at the Agencies that are going to compile the SAR.
- The importance of a team approach (critical, collegial, constructive dialogue and discussion) should be emphasised and encouraged.

2. Evidence/Supportive Documents:

 Agencies should be advised on a proper structure for organising the evidence and related documents.
