Background to the HAQAA agency reviews and consultancy visits

Quality assurance in higher education is recognised as a key strategic area in the 2063 Agenda of the African Union, which prioritises a number of tools and measures for harmonising the African higher education sector and rendering it both local responsive and globally competitive. Higher education quality assurance collaboration, and harmonisation more generally, is also a successful area of collaboration under the Joint Africa-EU Strategy. The aim is to establish compatible structures and systems which would facilitate academic mobility and foster comparability of qualifications.

Support to achieve these aims was provided in 2015-2018 by the Harmonisation of African Higher Education Quality Assurance and Accreditation (HAQAA) Initiative, funded by the European Union under the Africa-EU Strategic Partnership. This Initiative facilitated the development of the African Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance (ASG-QA) and a methodology for the peer review of external quality assurance agencies against the standards of Parts B and C of the ASG-QA. In 2018, teams of experts conducted four pilot reviews of national external quality assurance agencies and four consultancy visits to higher education ministries in five different African Union regions.

In order to continue the development and strengthening of external quality assurance in Africa, the second phase of the HAQAA Initiative (HAQAA2: 2020-2022) is coordinating further reviews of established external quality assurance agencies, and consultancy visits to countries in which there is a newly established quality assurance agency or preparations are underway to set one up.

ASG-QA

The ASG-QA were developed in 2015-2018 on the basis of a mapping of existing national and regional standards in Africa, as well as lessons learnt from Europe with the ESG. The ASG-QA follow a similar format to the ESG (Parts A, B and C of the ASG-QA correspond to Parts I, 2 and 3 of the ESG, and they are structured as standards and guidelines). The key differences are that the ASG-QA going into greater detail, and they also include specific guidance for open and distance education. The full ASG-QA are available here.

Agency reviews

These are full review of the agency against the standards of Parts B and C of the ASG-QA. The methodology is similar to that used in ENQA's agency reviews, i.e. self-assessment phase, site visit by a panel of experts (in this case two African experts and one European expert), and a report with findings and recommendations for improvement. However, as these agency reviews are still considered to be in a pilot phase, no compliance judgements are issued, it is not obligatory to publish the final review report (although many agencies in the first round of reviews did so voluntarily) and there are no formal consequences to the review process.

Consultancy visits

The consultancy visits are aimed at agencies that are only recently established or ministries that are in the process of setting up an independent agency and transferring responsibility for external quality assurance. The basic methodology is the same as for the agency reviews except that the agency is only required to address certain selected standards in the SAR, and the final review report will only address the standards for which there is evidence available. The site visit and review report also take on a more 'developmental' tone in recognition of the fact that the external quality assurance activities are not fully established. Similar to the agency reviews there are no compliance judgments and no formal consequences of the consultancy visits.

Training for experts

The preparatory training will gather the 27 African experts who are selected to be part of review panels, as well as some additional experts in order to train them for future visits and to grow the pool of experts.

The training will make the experts acquainted with the content, format and methodology of the review process. It furthermore gives the experts an opportunity to familiarise themselves with the ASG-QA and the broader policy context, in order to better contextualise the requirements of the pilot reviews in the continental setting.

Three external trainers will be invited to the event – both European experts experienced in agency reviews and also the context of the HAQAA Initiative, and African experts who took part in the first round of agency reviews and consultancy visits. ENQA, DAAD, AAU and OBREAL Global will attend in a secretarial and logistical capacity and also serve as facilitators and trainers where appropriate.
